

Use of “My Reports” Functionality in Epic for GME Purposes & Population Health Management

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GME Struggles with Accurate Reporting

- Reporting Systems Usually Separated from EHR System
- Manual Data Entry by Resident
 - Forgetting Cases/Encounters
 - Lacking Time to Log Cases/Encounters
 - Discontinuing Logs Once Graduation Requirements Met

CASE ONE: The Lost Papers

- PGY-3 in office almost in tears— “my husband threw away all of my paper logs from Children’s Hospital despite the sign I had on top that said— *DO NOT TOUCH!*”
- Pediatric Inpatient and ED Requirements of 100/100 and 250 Total

CASE TWO: Deliveries

- PGY-2 with interest in completing an Ob Fellowship, but she is concerned about her Vaginal Delivery numbers– only has 15 documented through first 2 rotations.

CASE THREE: Procedure Logs

- ACGME has issued a formal Area for Improvement to their program for multiple Procedures falling lower than national average—GME office questioning under-reporting by residents

CASE FOUR: Inpatient Encounters

- Off-Cycle PGY-3 in office concerned about recent Inpatient Report showing her 75 encounters under the 750 required for graduation— she has already completed her 6 months of inpatient medicine and night mole coverage.

CASE FIVE: Faculty Privileges

- Aurora Sinai Hospital Privileges committee seeking Circumcision Logs for all faculty that wish to continue procedure privilege.

CASE SIX: Population Health

- “Is there a way to create a list of my patients with Diabetes so I can ensure that I stay up on their care?”
